

Macdonald heads Sangster Fund team

The Prime Minister, the Hon. Hugh Shearer, announced today that Sir Herbert Macdonald has accepted the invitation of the Government to be chairman of the select committee which has been appointed in connection with the "Sir Donald Sangster Memorial Fund".

The other members, Mr. Shearer said, are Sir Philip Sherlock, Vice Chancellor of the University of the West Indies, Hon. Spencer Hendricks, Custos of St. Elizabeth, Mr. Douglas Fletcher, a former Senator, and Mr. H. R. Sharp, a businessman of Clarendon.

This select committee, the Prime Minister said, has been set up to determine, in consultation with the Government and members of the late Sir Donald's family, the purpose for which the Fund should be used.

Mr. Shearer said that the Bank of Nova Scotia had kindly agreed to accept donations from the public for this fund which he launched with a personal donation of One Hundred Pounds last week Tuesday. Members of the Cabinet have also agreed to contribute Fifty Pounds each, and Sir Alexander and Lady Bustamante are contributing Two Hundred Pounds.

Donations received so far by the Bank of Nova Scotia, include one hundred guineas from Messrs. Hand Arnold (Ja.) Ltd., twenty five pounds from Messrs. Storks deRoux and Son, and five guineas from Dr. K. B. A. Sanley.
