

# Carleton U confers honorary LL.D on Sir Philip

The honorary degree of Doctor of Laws (LL.D.) was conferred yesterday by Carleton University, Canada on Sir Philip Sherlock, C.B.E., B.A., LL.D. at a convocation at which Sir Philip gave the address.

Carleton University was established in 1942 and became a full university in 1957. In 1965/66 it had 3,024 full-time students and 2,506 part-time students; in addition there were 1,192 extension/adult education and 1,860 summer

school students.

This is the fourth university to confer an honorary degree on Sir Philip Sherlock; the first was Leeds University with the LL.D. in 1959. Last year two Canadian Universities honoured him, New Brunswick with the D.C.L. (Doctor of Civil Law) and Acadia with the D. Litt. (Doctor of Literature). At Acadia on October 22 Dr. Sherlock (as he then was) gave the convocation address.
