SIR PHILIP MANDERSON SHERLOCK was born in Jamaica in 1902 and was educated at Calabar High School and took a degree from the University of London. He became Secretary and Librarian to the Institute of Jamaica from 1938 to 1945 and then Director of Extra-Mural Studies in the University College of the West Indies. From 1963 to 1969 he was Vice-Chancellor of the University of the West Indies and is now Secretary-General of Caribbean Universities. He was knighted in 1967.

Sir Philip is a poet and short story writer and his publications include Anansi - The Spider Man, West India Folk Tales and Shout for Freedom, A Tribute to Sam Sharpe (1976).
