

Sherlock Appointed

Vice-Principal

Of University College

*Will Continue As
Extra Mural Head*

Decision made at meeting of Council

Mr. Philip M. Sherlock B.A., has been appointed Vice Principal of the University College of the West Indies. The appointment was made by the Council of the College during the current sessions which opened last Monday morning at Mona, Hope.

The Vice-Principal, however, will continue in his substantive post of Director of the Extra Mural Department.

The appointment to the second highest executive post of the man who more than anyone else is charged with future adult education in the West Indies, was made by the Council at its first meeting on Tuesday after the granting of the Royal Charter by the King.

Mr. Sherlock has been Director of the Extra Mural Department since its creation. He has travelled extensively around the West Indies and is considered well acquainted with the education problems of the Caribbean territory.

Career

Born in Portland, Jamaica, in 1902, Mr. Sherlock first entered island educational circles with his appointment as Assistant Master of Calabar High School. He was next headmaster of Manchester High School, and in 1933 was appointed headmaster of Wolmer's Boys' School.

In 1938 he headed the island's cultural movement as secretary and Librarian of the Institute. This was followed by his placement as Educational Officer of Jamaica Welfare Ltd., from which post he was named to the directorship of the Extra Mural department, following his appointment to the Committee on Higher Education in the West Indies.

The new Vice Principal is also well known as a compiler of text books for use in West Indian elementary schools and was a co-editor of *Caribbean Readers* with Mr. A. J. Newman.
