

This Indenture made the Thirtieth day of July in the Year of our  
 Lord Christ one Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty five and in the first  
 year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George by the grace of God  
 King of Great Britain, France and Ireland Defender of the Faith  
 Between Phillipa Rose of the parish of Saint Gilberts in the fields in  
 the County of Middlesex Spinster fourth daughter of Hulk Rose of  
 the Island of Jamaica in parts beyond the Seas Esquire Deceased of  
 the first part Hans Sloane of the parish and County aforesaid  
 Doctor in Physic and Elizabeth his wife late wife of the said Hulk  
Rose (Mother of the said Phillipa) and sole executrix of his last Will  
 and Testament of the second part and Sir Gilbert Heathcote of London  
 Knight and William Heathcote of the same Merchant Executors of  
 the last Will and Testament of John Heathcote of London aforesaid  
 Deceased of the third part Whereas the said Hulk Rose being  
 seized to him and his heirs of Divers Plantations Lands and  
 Hereditaments in the said Island of Jamaica and likewise  
 possessed of a very considerable ~~and~~ personall Estate did by  
 his last Will and Testament in Writing bearing date the  
 Twenty Seventh day of October in the Year of our Lord God  
 One Thousand Six Hundred Ninety and Three Give and Bequeath  
 (amongst other things) In case his Wife should be with child  
 of a Daughter to such Girl the Sum of Eighteen Hundred pounds  
 And Whereas the said Hulk Rose soon after the making his  
 said Will Departed this Life leaving three Daughters Elizabeth  
Mary and Anne and the said Elizabeth his wife executrix of  
 the said Phillippa Rose Party to these Presents who after was  
 born and thereby became entitled to the said <sup>Legacy</sup> ~~Sum~~ and Request  
 of her said father And Whereas the said Hulk Rose by his  
 last Will and Testament did will that each of his children  
 that he should leave behind him should be paid and allowed  
 the Sum of Seventy pounds per Ann until they came to the  
 age of Ten years for and towards their maintenance and  
 Education and afterwards the sum of Eighty pounds per  
 Ann and in case other of his said Daughters shall happen

to Dye before they come to the age of Seventeen Yeares or  
 he married then he gave her Portion to be divided to and  
 amongst the ~~Survivors~~ Survivors and of his said Will did  
 Institute and appoint his Loving Wife Elizabeth Rose (now  
 Elizabeth Sloane) Sole Executrix and did give and  
 Bequeath unto her in Right of her dower the third part  
 ? of the neat produce and profits of all his Estate whatsoever  
 during her naturall Life <sup>as</sup> and also the money His Brother  
 Francis Rose owed him and <sup>as</sup> <sup>much</sup> more money to be paid her  
 out of his Estate <sup>within two</sup> years after his Decese as would  
 make up the sum of Two Thousand pounds to and for  
 her own use during her life and at her Decese to be  
 disposed and given to his Children at her Discretion  
 and did nominate institute and appoint Samuel Bernard  
 Esquire Mathew Gregory Esquire Edward Broughton Esquire  
 his Brother Captain Francis Rose and Sir Robert ~~Needham~~ <sup>Needham</sup> to  
 be Trustees and Oversees of his said will and did Will and  
 Bequeath that the Rest and Residue of his Estate (the  
 Legacies and contingent charge requests being first paid) should  
 be paid into the hands of his Trustees or Major part of them  
 to be by them secured and improved for the best advantage  
 and profit of <sup>all</sup> his said daughters jointly as by the said will  
 more fully may appear and whereas the said Elizabeth  
 Sloane Relict of the said Hulk Rose after his Decese  
 proved the said will and took upon her the Execution  
 of thereof and Intermarried with the said Hans Sloane and  
whereas the said Mathew Gregory Edward Broughton &  
 Francis Rose and Robert Needham accepted the said Trust  
 and since the Intermarriage of the said Elizabeth  
 Relict and Execution of the said Hulk Rose with the  
 said Hans Sloane Preferred their Bill in the High Court  
 of Chancery against the said Hans Sloane and Elizabeth  
 his wife and the said Elizabeth Anne Mary and the  
 said Philippa Rose (the four Daughters of the said Hulk Rose)

by the said Elizabeth Sloane their Mother & guardian praying  
 the Directions of the same Court touching the Will and Devises  
 of the said Testator and the Execution of the Trust in them  
 Reposed And that the Plaintiffs and Defendants the said  
 Hans Sloane and Elizabeth his Wife might from time to  
 time Account before a Master of the said Court touching  
 their Receipts and payments and also praying to have  
 the Direction of the Court touching the disposal of the  
 Same all which was accordingly Ordered and Decreed and  
 the said Trustees and the said Defendants the said Hans  
 Sloane and Elizabeth his wife have accordingly accounted  
 for the said Testators Estate before Thomas Pitt Esquire  
 late one of the Masters of the said Court and Great part  
 thereof hath been placed ~~in~~ at interest on Securities  
 approved of by the said Master And Whereas upon  
 application made to the said Court of Chancery for a  
 Distribution to be made of the said Estate by an Order  
 of the said Court made in the said cause the ffive and  
 Twentieth day of June in the second year of her late  
 Majesty of Queen Anne It Was Ordered and Decreed  
 that a third part of the Partible Estate be sett out  
 by the said Master for the benefit of the said Hans  
 Sloane and his wife otherwise that the said Testators  
 children when they Receive their <sup>Respective</sup> Shares to  
 their own use do give Security for that purpose unless the  
 said Hans Sloane and his Wife should agree with the  
 said Testators daughters or any of them to accept from them  
 a Rempence for such third part and that the Rest  
 and Residue of the said Testators Partible Estate Subject  
 to a charge thereon of Thirty pounds per Ann to one  
 Elizabeth <sup>Milner</sup> ~~Sloane~~ for her life be Divided by the said  
 Master equally amongst the said four daughters and that  
 the same together with the Proceed of the said Testators  
 Estate to be paid to each of the said daughters and that the

same together with according to their Respective shares and  
Interests as they should Respectively attain their ages of One  
and Twenty Years or be married and for that purpose the  
said Master was to look into the Securities taken for the  
Testators Estate and also for the Produce thereof and to apportion  
to each Daughter such Securities for their respective shares as he  
should think fit And Whereas in pursuance of the said Order  
the said Master made his Report bearing date the Twelfth day  
of July in the said second Year of her late Majesty Queen Anne  
and thereby reported due to the said Philippa Rose for her  
share of the Produce of the said Testators Estate Seven Hundred  
Twenty One pounds Two shillings and four pence Two Hundred  
forty five pounds nineteen Shillings and One penny Five hundred  
Ninety Two pounds seven shillings and four pence and One  
hundred Ninety and five pounds nine Shillings and Two pence  
and also the sum of four Hundred Eighty nine pounds nine  
Shillings and Six pence farthing for her fourth part of the Sum  
of One thousand or share of the Partible Estate of the said  
Testator then Received and that there was further due  
to the said Philippa One fourth part of the Sum of One  
thousand four hundred Ninety and three pounds Three  
Shillings and Ten pence of Debts then standing out and now  
unreceived which is to be Divided amongst the said four  
Daughters when and as the same shall be Received which said  
several Sums together with the sum of fiftym hundred pounds  
hereinafore mentioned to be given to her the said Philippa by the  
said Testator will do amount to the Sum of three Thousand  
seven hundred <sup>four</sup> fiftypounds seven shillings five pence three  
farthings and in satisfaction of the said Sum of money so  
Reported do to the said Philippa the said Master <sup>did appoint</sup> that she  
should have fiftym hundred pounds part thereof secured to  
her upon the Remainder of Captain Henry Eatons Mortgage  
therein mentioned and that two thousand pounds  
the part thereof should be secured to her on the

Eight Hundred and Seventy pounds and that after the charges expended in and about the ~~Act~~ Recovery thereof being deducted as also the sume of

Remainder of the Earle of Radnor's Mortgage in the said Report likewise mentioned and that the Remainder of the moneys so reported due to her as aforesaid being Two hundred forty four pounds seven shillings five pence three farthings be secured for her Benefit out of the moneys in the Hands of the said John Heathcote Deceased appointed for and on behalfe of the said Trustees and of the said Hans Sloane and Elizabeth his wife to manage and Receive the produce and profits of the said Testators Estate And whereas the said Master by one other Report bearing date on the thirty first day of May One Thousand Seven Hundred and Seven did Certify that since the making the former Report there had been Received from the said Testators Partible Estate the debt due from the African Company being the sume of five hundred seventy and four pounds six shillings and One penny and that with Interest for the same (that being likewise Deceased) it amounted together to the sume of Ninety two pounds fourteen Shillings paid to the said Hans Sloane for the said Elizabeth's share and that these Remained to be Divided into four equal parts amongst the said Testators Daughters the sume of Three and Twenty pounds Seventeen Shillings and Eleven pence and that the fourth part of the said Two sumes of Seven Hundred Seven ty Eight pounds seventeen shillings and three and Twenty pounds Seventeen Shillings and Eleven pence being One Hundred Eighty and eight pounds three shillings and nine pence halfe penny did belong to the said Philippa as her share of the said Debts and did ~~dit~~ likewise Certify that by means of the same as also by her share of the proceed of the Testators Estate as also by the Interest of the moneys Reported due to her by his former Report after all Law charges taxes and other contingent Expenses as also the expence for her maintenance and education being first Deducted there then Remained due to the said

Philippa the Summe of ffour Thousand One Hundred and  
Thirteen pounds and six pence And Whereas soon after  
the making the said Report the said Captain Henry Tate  
did pay of and Discharge the summe of three thousand  
and ffive hundred pounds and all Interest for the same  
secured by Mortgage on his Estate (of which the said Summe  
of ffifteen Hundred pounds <sup>appertained</sup> to her the said Philippa by  
the said Master was part and that the moneys or some  
part thereof thereupon lying Dead Application was made  
to the said Court of Chancery in behalf of the said Philippa  
by the said Hans Sloane and Elizabeth his Wife that  
the same might be placed out at Interest on some Government  
Security or East India Bonds which was by order of the  
said Court bearing date on the seventh day of May One  
Thousand Seven Hundred and ffive Ordered accordingly  
And Whereas the same in pursuance of the said Order  
was placed out on East India Bonds and has been ever since  
together with such other Summes of money of the said  
Philippa as from time to time have been received) Managed  
and Disposed of to and for the best profit and advantage  
of her the said Philippa And Whereas some time since the  
said John Heathcote Departed this life and did by his  
last Will and Testament in Writing make the said  
Sir Gilbert Heathcote and William Heathcote his  
Executors and that thereupon the said Hans Sloane  
and Elizabeth his wife did apply to the said William  
Heathcote that he would take upon him the Management  
and Receipt of the Produce and profits of the Moneys  
and Portion of her the said Philippa in like manner as  
the said John Heathcote in his lifetime had done which  
the said William Heathcote consented to do And  
Whereas on the two and twentieth day of April last  
the said Philippa did attain to the age of One and  
Twenty years and thereby became Entitled to receive

her portion into her own hands and have it under her own Management And whereas the said Philippa hath fully considered of all the said Premises and likewise of the Decrees Orders and Reports that have been made in the said High Court of Chancery touching the same and whereas upon an Account made up and stated the day before the <sup>day of the</sup> date of these presents Between her the said Philippa Rose and the said Hans Sloane and since the said William Heathcote there appeared to be then due to her the said Philippa after all expenses for Land Charges Taxes Education maintenance and other contingent charges <sup>and goings</sup> out Deducted the said Summe of Two Thousand pounds secured on a Mortgage of my Lord Radnor as aforesaid with Interest for the same after the Rate of six pounds per Cent. per Annum from the fourteenth day of April 1712 and likewise the sum of Three Thousand and one pounds eleven shillings and three pence in Ready money which Account has been respectively signed by the said ~~Philippa~~ Philippa Rose and the said William Heathcote Now this Indenture Witnesseth that the said Philippa Rose doth agree to and with the said Hans Sloane and Elizabeth his wife and the said William Heathcote that the said Account is a just and true Account and doth likewise acknowledge and declare that she has assented and submitted to the said several Decrees Orders and reports hereinafore mentioned And This Indenture further Witnesseth that she the said Philippa Rose in consideration of the said Summe of Ready Money viz Three thousand and one pounds eleven shillings and three pence in hand paid to her the said Philippa by them the said Hans Sloane and William Heathcote or one of them att or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the Receipt whereof she doth hereby acknowledge doth by these presents acquit






Decrees Orders and Reports which have been made in the said High Court of Chancery touching the Dividing disposing or managing the Estate late of the said ffulk Rose and the profits and produce thereof or in anywise relating therunto provided always that nothing herein before contained shall be construed or taken to Debar or hinder the said Philippa Rose or any claiming by from or under her or from her ffather part or share in the Possible Estate of the said ffulk Rose standing out and unowed when and as the same shall be paid and Received nor of or from any part share or Interest in the Estate of the said ffulk Rose ~~no~~ which shall or may at any time hereafter accrue to the said Philippa Rose by means or virtue of the said Will of the said ffulk Rose nor to Debar or exclude the said Philippa Rose from any part or share of the said Two Thousand pounds Devised to the said Elizabeth Sloane (Mother of the said Philippa) for her Life and at her Decease to be Disposed of and given to her children at her Discretion and saving and excepting out of these presents all such Right Title Interest Trust Benefit and Demand whatsoever which she the said Philippa Rose hath in to or out of the said Summe of Two Thousand pounds and Interest secured by Mortgage on the Estate of the Earle of Radnor as aforesaid And This Indenture Further Witnesseth that the said Hans Sloane in Consideration of the Premises doth by these presents acquitt Release and discharge the said Philippa Rose her Executors Administrators and Assignes of and from all Accounts Debt's Dues and Demands whatsoever for or in Respect of the maintenance and education of the said Philippa Rose or any Disbursements for her or upon her account or for or in Respect of the management of the Estate and affairs of the said Philippa or otherwise howsoever to the day of the date

Of these presents And Likewise the said Sir Gilbert  
 Heathcote and William Heathcote as Executors of the said  
 John Heathcote and the said William Heathcote in  
 consideration of the Premises do respectively acquit  
 Release and Discharge the said Philippa Roe her  
 Executors Administrators and Assignes of and from all  
 Accounts Debts Dues and Demands whatso ever for<sup>or</sup> in  
 Respect of any Disbursements for her or upon her  
 Account or for or in Respect of the management of the  
 Estate and Affairs of the said Philippa or otherwise
