THE MID-CLARENDON (IRRIGATION AREA)  
(AMENDMENT) ORDER, 1967

The Minister of Agriculture and Lands on the 20th day of October, 1967 in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 3(1) of the Irrigation Law, Chapter 168, made the Mid-Clarendon (Irrigation Area) (Amendment) Order, 1967, copies of which are attached.

2. Under the provision of Section 3(2) of the Law, this Order requires the confirmation of the House of Representatives and the Senate in order to be effective and a Resolution seeking confirmation of this House will accordingly be moved by the Minister of Agriculture and Lands.

THE IRRIGATION LAW  
(Cap. 168)

The Mid-Clarendon (Irrigation Area)  
Amendment) Order, 1967

In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Minister by section 3 of the Irrigation Law, the following Order is hereby made:-

1. This Order may be cited as the Mid-Clarendon (Irrigation Area) (Amendment) Order, 1967, and shall be read and construed as one with the Mid-Clarendon (Irrigation Area) Order, 1950, hereinafter referred to as the principal Order.

2. The Schedule to the principal Order is hereby amended in the following respects:-

(a) by deleting the fullstop after the words "starting place" at the end of the Schedule;  
and

(b) by adding next after the words "starting place" the following -

" together with all those parcels of land now known as Fort Simonds, formerly known as Manningsfield, parts of Old Yarmouth, Sandy Gully, Vere Irrigation Canal, New Yarmouth and Gimme-Me-Bit in the parish of Clarendon together containing by survey Two Thousand Two Hundred and Ten Acres One Rood and Five Perches of the shapes and dimensions and butting as appear by the plan referred to in Certificate of Title registered at Volume 390 Folio 141 and said to belong to the Government of Jamaica."
