The Programme to be Discussed:

1. The Social Development of the Entire Negro Race.
2. The Creating of a Thorough Educational System for the Higher Education of the Negroes of America, West Indies and Africa.
3. The Creating of General Economic Opportunities in Agriculture, Industry and Commerce for the Negro People of the World whereby a Brisk and Proper Trade Relationship may Develop between America, Africa, the West Indies, and South and Central America to Insure a Stable Economic Status.
4. The Acquiring and Controlling of Agricultural Lands for the Scientific Development of Agriculture and also the Establishment of Factories Industrial Institutions in Various Communities to Guarantee Permanent Employment.
5. General presentation of Subjects for discussion in Art, Literature, Music, Science, Politics, the Professions, Commerce, Industry, Education, Statesmanship, and Religion.
6. Drafting a plan for the Economic and Social Development of Jamaica.

To All The People Of Jamaica

FELLOW COUNTRYMEN:

This year—1934—is the Centenary year of Emancipation and this great Anniversary is to be celebrated during the month of August from the 1st to the 31st, day and night befittingly. We who have benefited from the act of Emancipation feel that we owe a duty to those who struggled and fought so bravely for our freedom and those who were liberal and considerate enough to have voted twenty million pounds for the Emancipation. To justify the Act of Emancipation we are to prove during the month of August the merit we claim for such an Act. We are all proud of our development within one hundred years, nevertheless, there is much more to be achieved, hence a Convention will be held in conjunction with the Celebrations, at which we are to discuss those important questions that affect our national life. Everyone is therefore asked to sympathetically assist in making this event a success. All the people of Jamaica are asked for intelligent co-operation for the success of the Convention and the Centenary Celebrations.

There is no doubt that our country is a loveable one, but unfortunately, we have not developed that social and economic system that would entirely guarantee our national happiness. We are striving, therefore, to the attainment of this when all of us as citizens and residents of this country may find a common cause aiming at true national development and prosperity. The Convention for the month of August will be held from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. at Edelweiss Park every day except Saturdays and Sundays, and from 8 p.m. to 10 p.m. each night except Saturdays and Sundays. The programme each Sunday will be of a religious, educational and social nature. Special literary and musical programmes will be rendered every Sunday from 4 p.m. to 6 p.m., and Mass demonstrations also of a religious and educative nature from 8 p.m. to 10 p.m. every Sunday. There will be special social functions every Saturday night throughout the month from 7 to 12 p.m. Some of our most prominent men and women in the Island will address the Convention during its sittings at its night and day Sessions. This is something for everybody to be interested in and so a general invitation is here extended to you for your co-operation and general assistance.
